- \*Steps to become an Official CTUIR GED Student\*
  - 1. Complete CTUIR GED Application for Services:
    - A. Call or visit Katherine at the GED CTUIR program at Nixyaawii Education Center, Room 221 or
      - a. email her for an application
    - B. Completed application -- submitted to Katherine for review:
      - a. Students under 18 years of age, additional requirements: high school release form signed by a school official and parent/guardian, and provide a copy of the Oregon Department of Education Parent/Guardian Consent Form
  - 2. Agree to a study contract set a goal:
    - A. Complete practice tests (voucher codes available for "Official CTUIR GED Students")
    - B. The GED Test is made up of 4 subjects, broken into separate exams. You can space them out however it suits you and go at your own pace. (check the back for more information on the 4 subjects)

# **Mathematics**

Test Topics - Basic Math - Geometry - Basic Algebra - Graphs and Functions

Time (to take the test) - 115 minutes - Short break between parts

### Format - 2 parts, calculator allowed on second part

- Access to calculator reference sheet and math formula sheet
- Multiple choice and other question types (drag and drop, fill-in-the-blank, select an area, and drop-down)

# **Reasoning Through Language Arts**

Test Topics - Reading for Meaning - Identifying and creating Arguments - Grammar and Language

Time (to take the test) - **150 minutes - 10-minute break between parts 2 and 3 – 45 minutes for the written essay** 

### Format - 3 sections - 1 written essay (extended response)

• Multiple choice and other question types (drag and drop, select an area, and drop down)

## **Social Studies**

Test Topics - Reading for Meaning in Social Studies - Analyzing Historical Events and Arguments in Social Studies - Using Numbers and Graphs in Social Studies

Time (to take the test) - 70 minutes - No breaks

### Format - Calculator allowed

- Access to calculator reference sheet
- Multiple choice and other question types (drag and drop, fill in the blank, select an area, and drop down)

# **Science**

Test Topics - Reading for Meaning in Science - Designing and Interpreting Science Experiments - Using Numbers and Graphics in Science

Time (to take the test) - 90 minutes - No breaks

### Format - Calculator allowed

- Access to calculator reference sheet
- Multiple choice and other questions types (fill in the brank, drag and drop, select an area, and drop down)

Scoring 145 - 164 Passing 165 - College Ready

The GED requires a **passing score of 145 for each subject**. Therefore, students will need to reach a score of at least 145 on each subject in order to receive the GED test credentials.
